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Glossary

1. Attention deficit disorder-syndrome of disordered learning and disruptive behavior that has several subtypes characterized primarily by symptoms of inattentiveness and/or hyperactivity and impulsive behavior.
2. Automatic external defibrillator-an electronic device used to defibrillate a heart by applying an electric shock.
3. Asthma-a chronic lung disorder that is marked by recurring episodes of airway obstruction manifested by labored breathing accompanied especially by wheezing and coughing and by a sense of constriction in the chest, and that is triggered by hyperreactivity to various stimuli.
4. Autism-a developmental disorder that appears by age three and that is recognized and diagnosed by impairment of the ability to form normal social relationships, impairment of the ability to communicate with others, and by stereotyped behavior patterns.
5. Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR)-emergency first aid procedure for a victim of cardiac arrest.
6. Cellulitis-inflammation of the connective tissue underlying the skin.
7. Central line-a central venous catheter (CVC or central (venous) line) is a catheter placed into a large vein in the neck, chest or groin
8. Diabetes- a disorder of carbohydrate metabolism caused by a combination of hereditary and environmental factors; usually characterized by inadequate secretion or utilization of insulin, excessive urine production, excessive amounts of sugar in the blood and urine, and by thirst, hunger, and weight loss.
9. Epinephrine- used medicinally especially as a heart stimulant, to treat open-angle glaucoma and life-threatening allergic reactions, to prolong the effects of local anesthetics, and as a bronchodilator.
10. Gastric tube- medical device inserted through a small incision in the abdomen into the stomach; used to provide nutrition to patients who cannot obtain nutrition by swallowing.
11. Glucagon- hormone that promotes an increase in the sugar content of the blood.
12. Glucose monitoring- measures the amount of glucose in the blood right at the time of sample collection.

13. Hemophilia- hereditary blood defect that occurs almost exclusively in males and is characterized by delayed clotting of the blood and consequent difficulty in controlling hemorrhage even after minor injuries.
14. Hickman catheter- an indwelling central venous line which provides direct access to the heart.
15. Human immunodeficiency virus- causes *acquired immunodeficiency syndrome* (AIDS), a condition in which the immune system begins to fail, leading to life-threatening opportunistic infections.
16. Immunization- process by which an individual is exposed to an agent that is designed to fortify his or her immune system against that agent.
17. Inhaler- a device designed to deliver medication via inhalation.
18. Nebulizer- an atomizer equipped to produce an extremely fine spray of medication for deep penetration of the lungs.
19. NO CODE-physician's order meaning "do not resuscitate".
20. Ostomy- surgically created opening in the body for the discharge of body wastes.
21. Pediculosis-infestation of head or body lice.
22. Pressure ulcer-skin breakdown caused by pressure or friction.
24. Scoliosis-curvature and deformity of the spine.
25. Seizure- convulsions, sensory disturbances, or loss of consciousness resulting from abnormal electrical discharges in the brain.
26. Sickle cell anemia-genetic disorder in which red blood cells change shape, assuming a "sickle"-shape.
27. Solu-Cortef- medication that may be used to treat bladder problems such as frequent need to urinate or loss of control of urinary function as well as other conditions.
28. Standard precautions-practice of avoiding contact with another person's bodily fluids.
29. Tracheostomy- the surgical formation of an opening into the trachea through the neck especially to allow the passage of air.

30. Urinary catheterization- insertion of a catheter into a patient's bladder in order to drain urine from the bladder into an attached bag or container.

31. Vagal nerve stimulator- device implanted in the brain in an attempt to decrease seizure activity.

32. Ventilator-a device for maintaining breathing.

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Introduction

Like society in general and healthcare nationally, school nursing in Alabama is in a state of flux. The profession is challenged to a greater degree than ever before by an overwhelming number of students who have healthcare needs and conditions of a higher level of acuity than have previously been seen in public school systems. In an attempt to meet the healthcare needs of students, Alabama allows the delegation of procedures such as assistance with medication to unlicensed assistive personnel. The Alabama Board of Nursing (the Board) is accountable for both the enforcement of regulations that allow for delegation to occur and assuring that the licensed nurses providing the delegation are competent in their practice. Rule 610-X-6-.06 of the Alabama Board of Nursing Administrative Code specifically addressed delegation by school nurses and stipulated that a report would be submitted to the Board upon request by either the State School Nurse Consultant or the School Nurse Administrator.

Since implementation of the regulations in 2001, the Board has requested a yearly report which addressed the current state of student populations as well as the nursing care provided by licensed and supervised, unlicensed personnel. The initial school health report was requested and compiled for academic year 2003-2004, with a more detailed report being compiled for the subsequent school year. A Monograph for each year has been printed and distributed to the State Department of Education, Governor Bob Riley, legislators, school superintendents, and interested stakeholders. The current report reflects data gathered during academic year 2006-2007 and is a comparison of the changes which have evolved in Alabama's delivery of healthcare to students from one year to the next.

Literature Review

The importance of the school nurse in providing healthcare services to public school students has been well established in the literature. Changes in society, the provision of healthcare, education, and the family structure have all combined to increase both the need and the demand for school health services. Furthermore, the public school systems must now cope with the ramifications of legal and illegal immigration, homelessness, divorce and blended families, violence, and substance abuse associated with every type of drug from alcohol to prescription pills to methamphetamine produced in homemade laboratories. The school nurse must have the central management role in the implementation of the school health services program and often must function as the team coordinator. Frequently, the healthcare team will include licensed practical nurses, unlicensed personnel such as clerical staff, guidance counselors, and

various physicians who will be consulted as necessary. As leader of the school health team, the school nurse must assess each student's health status, identify health problems that could potentially create a barrier to educational progress, and develop a health care plan for management of these problems in the school environment (Taras, Frankowski, McGrath, Mears, Murray, and Young, 2001).

Once the importance of school nurses in the provision of healthcare is established, an adequate number of licensed nurses to provide health services must be obtained. Wolfe and Selekman (2002) noted that the National Association of School Nurses has recommended that the school nurse to student ratio should be 1:750 in the general school population, 1:225 in the mainstreamed student population, 1:125 in the severely chronically ill or disabled population, and possibly even lower for medically fragile students. This ratio is not being met in some of Alabama's more rural counties, as is shown in Appendix A, which provides a report of data collected on a system-by-system basis. Furthermore, despite federal recommendations regarding the ratio of nurses to students, the U.S. Department of Education believes that state and local officials determine staffing needs, according to Susan Asprey, press secretary for the Department. School districts frequently struggle to find the financial resources needed to hire nurses. Also, many nurses balk at the salary deficit experienced by many school nurses. A 2004 survey by the National School Nurses Association revealed that the median salary for a school nurse was approximately \$36,000 annually, considerably less than the pay for a hospital-based nurse (Horovitz and McCoy, 2005). School nurse allocations for Alabama's school systems for both the 2005-2006 and 2006-2007 academic years are shown in Appendix A (Alabama School Journal, 2006).

In reviewing data presented in Appendix A, it should be noted that the data are reflective of the 1995 passage of the Foundation Program by then-Governor Fob James Jr. The law was designed to promote educational opportunity for all children attending Alabama's public schools. In order to participate in the Foundation Program and therefore receive state funding, each local school system was required to pledge a portion of its local revenues to be included in the funding requirements of the program. All school systems chose to participate. The primary focus of the funding process is the provision of state funds to cover the salaries and benefit packages of the personnel who are known as "foundation units". This group consists of principals, classroom teachers, assistant principals, librarians, and counselors. In order to calculate the number of foundation units to be funded for a specific fiscal year, each school system must accurately report its student enrollment during the first 20 days after the Labor Day holiday. This constitutes the Average Daily Membership report, which figures prominently in Appendix A. This means that students who enroll or withdraw from school after the 20th day following Labor Day have no effect on the state foundation funding process for the succeeding year. The Average Daily Membership calculations for one year form the basis of the funding calculations for the following academic year (Alabama Education Association, 2007).

Procedure

The instrument for data compilation consisted of a survey which was distributed to 134 Alabama public school systems and 1451 public schools. The survey instrument is shown in Appendix C. Questions were validated for appropriate wording and content by Board members and staff as well as the State School Nurse Consultant in the State Department of Education. Detailed instructions for completion of the survey were sent to each nurse via electronic mail. The survey was placed online on the Board's website and was intended to be completed by responders between November 1 and November 20, 2006. Response rate was 100%, with the registered nurses assigned to the schools being required to complete the report. Some school systems failed to meet the required timeframe for survey completion, with the final participant providing data on December 21st, 2006. In the case of some school systems which have a Lead Nurse or Nurse Administrator overseeing the School Health Program, these personnel chose to be accountable for the completion and submission of reports for each school in their system.

Findings

Once data had been compiled, it became clear that a longitudinal comparison of the calculations derived from the current year's report and the calculations from the previous year's report could be determined. A compilation of the data derived from the 2006-2007 academic year's survey is included in Tables 1-8, with Table 8 being a report of nurses' comments regarding barriers or challenges to the provision of health services in Alabama public school systems. Calculation of descriptive statistics was performed on data submitted by each school system. Compilation of identifying information on each school system presented in Table 1 revealed that 1,324 of the systems have a lead nurse or Nurse Administrator who is accountable for the system's School Health Program (91.25%). When the Registered Nurse (RN) of each school was asked on the survey how many days per week students in that particular school had access to an on-site licensed nurse, the overwhelming response was daily access. However, the fact that 118 nurses completing the survey reported that the students being served in that specific school system did not have access to a licensed nurse raises concerns. It is recommended that when the survey is administered for academic year 2007-2008, terms utilized such as "access to a licensed nurse" be clarified. This would increase the knowledge base of the respondents completing the survey and also increase the validity and reliability of the findings reported.

Nurses were also questioned regarding the frequency with which a supervising RN conducts on-site supervision of Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) employed by the school system. Although 649 (49.35%) of school systems reported that this question was not applicable to them, 666 (50.65%) systems responded that on-site supervision occurred as often as daily (2.74%) and as often infrequently as less than once monthly (3.12%). Furthermore, nurses were

also questioned regarding the frequency with which a licensed nurse monitors unlicensed school personnel who are delegated the task of assisting with medications. To this question, school systems reported frequency of supervision ranging from daily (1.12%) to less than once monthly (24.3%). The variance in the amount of supervision of unlicensed personnel is a concern in light of the intense nature of the procedures being performed, medications being administered, and conditions being monitored in Alabama’s public school systems.

Review of personnel information compiled revealed that 893 licensed nurses are now employed full-time in Alabama’s public school systems. The knowledge base of the respondents completing the survey again becomes questionable when the 893 full-time nurses reported is compared with the 1451 public schools completing the survey. Although the number of full-time nurses is a significant decrease from the previous year (26.92%), it is believed that school systems during the previous year may have combined full-time and part-time nurses employed into one number. A comparison of personnel information from the two academic years may be seen in Table 9. It should be noted that nurses assigned to one classroom as well as nurses assigned to one student both increased. The number of substitute nurses increased to such a degree that it is believed that school systems either over reported this number during the current academic year or underreported it during the previous year. A comparative graph showing data derived from the two academic years is shown as Figure 1.



Further review of personnel information compiled from the survey revealed that most nurses responding reported spending one to five (149 nurses) and ten to twenty (109 nurses) hours per month on field trips with students. Also, 35.06% of the nurses who were required to accompany students on buses reported spending between one and five hours on this task. An additional one to five hours per month was reported to have been spent by 47.26% of nurses who were required to attend student extracurricular activities.

In addition to their regularly scheduled healthcare activities, nurses in Alabama provide a great deal of individualized health-related teaching to students, with 45.39% of nurses reporting between one and five hours spent per month. Also, 48.42% of responding nurses reported that one to five hours per month was spent counseling students and, in some cases, parents regarding the need to obtain follow-up medical care. A wide variety of health promotional activities are occurring as a result of the presence of nurses in the public school systems. These include vision and hearing screenings, health fairs, scoliosis screenings, and influenza prevention clinics.


Review of medication information revealed that most responding nurses (96.15%) have a method in their public school for maintaining the privacy of students who are receiving assistance with their medication as well as a method for maintaining the security of medications being administered (96.82% of responding nurses). Also, 82.98% of responding nurses reported having an area available for the refrigeration of medications. Interestingly, 84.48% of nurses responded that they had not completed a single unusual occurrence report specific to medications since the beginning of the academic year. This is in sharp contrast to a study conducted by the National Association of School Nurses (NASN) which assessed practices and concerns associated with medication administration in schools. Among respondents to the NASN survey, 48% reported that at least one medication error had occurred within the past year, with the primary type of error occurring being a missed dose of medication (McCarthy, 2000).

A comparison of medication information from the 2005-2006 and 2006-2007 academic years may be seen in Table 10. A comparative graph showing the data derived from the two academic years is shown as Figure 2. It should be noted that the number of breathing treatments being administered in Alabama's public school systems increased 307.45%, the number of medications used to treat Attention Deficit Disorder increased 354.37%, and the number of oral antibiotics being administered increased 498.83% from one academic year to the subsequent year.

Review of procedure information compiled from the survey revealed that the most frequently performed procedures were access to an automatic external defibrillator as well as oral suctioning. The numbers were so high for these procedures (7,917 and 7,357, respectively) that it is believed that a few nurses misinterpreted access to an external defibrillator to be synonymous with use of the defibrillator, with a similar interpretation existing for oral suctioning. These large numbers were only reported by twelve schools out of the 1,451 schools reporting data. A comparison of procedure information from the 2005-2006 and 2006-2007 academic years may be seen in Table 11. A comparative graph showing the data derived from the two academic years is shown as Figure 3. It should be noted that the procedure of administration of blood products increased 29.03% from one academic year to the next, while the number of ventilators in

use and requiring care increased 44.44%, from five in use throughout the public school systems to nine in use.

A review of information on various conditions compiled from the survey revealed that the most prevalent conditions experienced by students in the public school systems were asthma, attention deficit disorder, and obesity as chronic disorders. In terms of acute disorders, more than 115,000 students required first aid since the beginning of the 2006-2007 academic year. Over 54,000 students were treated by school nurses for pain, with abdominal pain being the primary location of the discomfort, and more than 46,000 students were treated for headaches. A comparison of condition information from the 2005-2006 and 2006-2007 academic years may be seen in Table 12. A comparative graph showing the data derived from the two academic years is shown as Figure 4. It should be noted that there was no significant increase in the number of students diagnosed with diabetes, hemophilia, mental illness, or seizure disorder from one academic year to the subsequent year.

Review of information compiled on physician's orders revealed that 970 (75.60%) of responding nurses reported having access to all of the necessary medical information of students served. The remaining 313 nurses responded that they were functioning daily in the school setting without having adequate medical information on each child served. This is particularly problematic when considered in light of the documentation of Individual Health Plans which are required from the U.S. Department of Education for students receiving special services. Furthermore, the main medications or treatments which were found to be ordered by physicians for students were self-administered inhalers (27.58%), medications for attention deficit disorder (18.17%), and inhalers requiring assistance (17.89%). It should be noted that 82 students in the state have physician's orders for "Do Not Resuscitate" if the students appear to require resuscitation. Nurses were not queried regarding such orders in the previous year's survey.

Finally, nurses were asked to report barriers or challenges to the provision of health services in their specific school system. Of particular concern was the challenge of "being supervised by a non-nurse". Many nurses in Alabama are supervised by Department of Education personnel who are in charge of the system's provision of health services but who are not necessarily nurses and have no medical knowledge. Communication between medical and non-medical personnel can become strained if tensions are allowed to escalate. Other challenges center around parents. Nurses noted that some parents are not consistently concerned about their children's health, frequently fail to become involved in the Individual Health Plan for each child, and often do not comply by bringing medication from the home environment so that it can be administered at school. When nurses attempted to involve parents in the health plan for their children, they found that the home telephone number had changed and the school was never notified, or that parents did not always respond to notes sent home from school. Furthermore, nurses noted that families frequently were without health insurance and often had a language barrier as well.

Figure 3: Procedure Information from 2005-2006 and 2006-2007




Limitations

The limitations of this research project are those associated with the implementation of any survey. The lack of random sampling involved in this type of survey research can lead to poor external validity. This means that, although the survey instrument utilized appears to measure what it was intended to measure, the results received may not be generalizable to school nurse populations outside of Alabama. Sources of error can result from sampling errors, question characteristics, and interviewer influences (Bigger, 2003).

A limitation specific to the administration of this survey was the respondents' interpretation of questions. Many nurses contacted the researcher requesting clarification on the timeframe utilized in each question, even though instructions e-mailed to all participants specified that nurses were to use the beginning of the academic year as the beginning of the timeframe for calculating numbers of students with various conditions, medications, or procedures. Furthermore, many nurses, though the only practitioner in their school system, counted themselves as being full-time for each school in that system, thereby causing the system to appear to have multiple nurses employed in its schools rather than only one. This required the researcher to spend additional man hours in scrutinizing each school system's entry in an attempt to determine duplicate entry of nurses.

Implication of Findings

As previously mentioned, nurses were questioned regarding the frequency with which a licensed nurse monitors unlicensed school personnel who are delegated the task of assisting with medications. To this question, school systems reported frequency of supervision ranging from daily (1.12%) to less than once monthly (24.3%). The vast difference in the amount of supervision which unlicensed personnel receive must be weighed against the intense nature of the procedures being performed, medications being administered, and conditions being monitored in Alabama's public school systems. The varying amounts of supervision must inevitably have an effect on the quality of health care being delivered.

The need for additional numbers of registered nurses in the public school systems is underscored by the additional hours which many nurses spent monthly providing healthcare to students which en route on buses, while on field trips, and while participating in extracurricular activities. Also, nurses are spending a considerable amount of time monthly in health promotional activities as well as in counseling both students and parents, when applicable, regarding the need for follow-up medical care. Furthermore, many nurses commented on the need to provide basic food and clothing for some students, particularly in the elementary schools. One nurse noted that she maintains a pantry with clothing in it for students who are sent to school inadequately clothed against inclement weather. The increasing incidence of child abuse was also commented upon by nurses. This speaks to the need for social workers to be available for collaboration with public school nurses when such problematic issues arise.

Another finding which has long-term implications is that of the failure of many nurses to complete a single unusual occurrence report since the beginning of the academic year. Although nurses may erroneously equate completion of such a document with failure to provide adequate healthcare to the student, the implication of such failure to document is a reduced amount of data which will be available for risk management purposes. However, the greatest concern is that nurses may not be documenting all aspects of student incidents or injuries, thus negating the opportunity for appropriate follow-up care and long-term monitoring.

Review of the findings on medications and procedures also produced implications for future practice of school nurses. The significant increase in the number of breathing treatments, medications to treat attention deficit disorder, as well as oral antibiotics being administered in the public school system should be further investigated. As part of the Individual Health Plan for students who are receiving an increased number of any of these medications than previously prescribed, the nurse should speak with the parents and possibly the prescribing physician to determine the rationale behind the significant increase in medications. The large number of students receiving treatment for pain should also receive follow-up. Nurses who recognize that particular students frequently complain of pain should attempt to isolate the area of discomfort and maintain a symptom journal in an effort to determine the existence of a pattern. Again,

follow-up should occur in the form of contact with parents and/or the primary physician.

A major concern is the 313 nurses who specified that they did not have access to adequate medical information on each of the students that they served. This means that the nurse is not prepared with sufficient information to implement a reasonable assessment and will not be able to document a complete Individualized Health Plan which addresses all of the health concerns of each student. As previously mentioned, this does not allow for adequate monitoring of student acute or chronic conditions nor for appropriate follow-up to incidents or evaluation of interventions.

Recommendations

Once the findings of the 2006-2007 school nurse survey are compiled and tabulated, recommendations which will affect the future practice of school nurses begin to emerge. Regarding the survey itself, it is recommended that both terms utilized and the timeframe in question be clarified in each succeeding year. Nurses who had answered the survey for a previous academic year were asked to provide data in certain sections for a typical day in their practice. The timeframe used in the 2006-2007 survey, the beginning of the academic year, despite being clearly provided in instructions sent to all participants, required clarification on a frequent basis.

The major recommendation resulting from the research involves documentation on the part of school nurses. Many nurses contacted the researcher to report that they did not know the exact number of students in a particular school that they served who had a specific disorder or received a certain medication and would try to provide an estimate. A uniform method of documentation which is followed by each school nurse will decrease the nurses' level of frustration and could potentially decrease the amount of time spent on paperwork. Public school nurses also should be annually retrained on the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act requirements and the process for acquiring necessary medical information on students. Although undoubtedly nurses are initially trained on all such requirements, periodic retraining would be helpful since the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act requirements were listed by nurses as a barrier to their provision of care to students. Fisher, Hunt, Kann, Kolbe, Patterson, and Wechsler (2007) discussed eight priority actions that states can implement which will improve the health and academic outcomes of their young people. Their top priority action is the monitoring of critical health-related behaviors among young people and the effectiveness of school policies and programs in promoting health-enhancing behaviors and an increased level of health. Such monitoring cannot occur without implementation of a uniform system of statewide documentation that is used conscientiously by each public school nurse.

As alluded to in a previous section, nurses also cited their frustration regarding the knowledge deficit of parents in relation to the health concerns of their children, lack of parental involvement, and failure to comply with

medical regimens. Fisher et al. (2007) recommended the formation of school health councils that would include parents and community representatives. This would be a natural forum for providing education to families as well as a method of involving professionals such as physicians, law enforcement officers, the media, as well as faculty from local community colleges in the process of being a resource for the school system.

Conclusion

It is clear from the content of this monograph that the health services provided in the public school system in Alabama are constantly evolving. It is the intent of the Center for Nursing to assess the provision of school health services on an annual basis and to develop a longitudinal view of the data provided each year. Although the services required by public school students are becoming more comprehensive and the acuity levels greater each year, the dedication of school nurses to the children that they serve continues to be evident. Many expressed great satisfaction with their ability as a school nurse to provide children with the nursing time that they had not been able to provide as acute care hospital-based nurses. It is hoped that Alabama's young people may continue to be served by these dedicated professionals.
